



Phase 2: EWP Engineering Underway

Thanks to some hard work from the Jamestown Community and its partners, we've completed [the Stream Corridor Master Plan](#) and lifted the building permit moratorium. So...now what?

As Mayor Tara Schoedinger outlined [in her update](#) at the January 28th Rebuild Jamestown Community Meeting, Jamestown has stepped into Phase 2 of our Floodplain Development Plan: The Technical Phase. For the next month, we will be actively working with Amec and the Natural Resources Conservation Services (NRCS) to move toward a planned floodplain elevation through Emergency Watershed Protection (EWP) Engineering.

The EWP program protects existing private properties and infrastructure from exigent situations where there is imminent risk to life or property. For Jamestown, this means protection against spring run off, which we know--left unchecked--could cause more serious flooding. We will be working toward an engineered design to prevent this from happening.

During this second phase, we are also working on an environmental assessment in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), which is an essential component to being allowed to do any

federally funded work within the stream. Thanks to the 2013 Sandy Recovery Improvement Act, we are doing a Unified Federal Review, which will allow us to do a single environmental assessment to satisfy the requirements from all of the different agencies that are involved and to expedite the process.

We have a lot to do in the next few weeks:

- Meet with the US Army Corps on lead agency and NEPA compliance
- Identify emergency actions vs. permanent actions (for permitting)
- Define FEMA's proposed actions (Project Worksheet (PW) review)
- Submit Cultural Resources Survey - architecture
- Submit Cultural Resources evaluation - archaeology

Once these steps are done, we intend to be ready on February 28th to kick off Phase 3: Construction.

Community input is an invaluable component of this plan and we are so grateful for how involved our community has been in this process. Together we are rebuilding Jamestown with more strength and resilience than ever before. We hope you will join us at the next Community Meeting on February 4th (5:30p-7:30p) at Casey Middle School!

Let's bring our community home.



Need help recovering?

Do you need help recovering from the 2013 Flood with needs such as rebuilding or repairing your home, paying your mortgage, replacing personal property or others?

If so, you are encouraged to come to one of our walk-in centers: **February 10-22.**

Why should you meet with the Long-Term Flood Recovery Group?

- It will help connect you to a personal resource navigator within the Long-Term Flood Recovery Group who can help find funds, volunteers and other resources
- It will help the community understand the scope of recovery needs in order to apply for grants, donations and other aid.

The Long-Term Flood Recovery Group is working with World Renew, a national disaster response agency whose volunteers will be here to help us gather data, prioritize needs and connect people with the resources they need. They meet with flood survivors one-on-one to determine current and future needs.

Residents affected by the 2013 Flood who need community assistance to help in their recovery can talk to a volunteer at one of the walk-in centers noted below.

Cistern Project -

Jamestown is making headway in its attempt to acquire cisterns for eligible residents. More information will be given as it becomes available.

The Water Plant is currently closed. Bids are being collected this week to begin work on the water plant. Covered in the scope of this first phase of the project:

- * Removal of sand media
- * Disinfection of plant
- * Replacing sand media

The selected engineering company will have 45 days to complete work.
